Snacks & Lunch		
Does the school provide food or drinks?	School provides healthy snack: 1) no sweetened foods, 2) minimally processed foods, 3) balance and variety. Snacks include fresh fruit or vegetables. School provides unlimited spring water. Full day students pack a lunch.	
What guidelines does the school have for food at school?	Nut-free. Parents may not send drinks to school. Parents are encouraged to send a healthy lunch. No sweetened foods are served regularly in the classroom, (not even for birthdays).

How do visitors gain access to the school?	Front door is locked with video monitor/intercom for identification before admittance.  Classroom floor locked separately.	
How are classrooms monitored?	Closed-circuit TV for parent observation & office staff monitoring.	
Playground	Soft surface (wood chips), fully fenced with childproof gate latches.	
Do teachers have current first- aid/CPR training	Yes, all teachers have current first-aid/CPR certification.	
Dismissal Policy	Only to persons pre-authorized by parent/guardian.
